Oct I-7





Tuesday, Oct 17 2-3pm



Tuesday, Oct 31 5-6:30pm



FREDERIC NURSING HOME AND REHABILIATION CENTER



NORTHWEST PASSAGE

Northwest Passage was established in Webster in 1978 and expanded its resources to Frederic in 1994. They are a residential treatment facility for girls and gender diverse adolescents between the ages of 12-17 with emotional and behavioral disorders. Today, the non-profit hosts up to 24 residents and about 120 employees at the Frederic center.

They are housed in the old hospital on the southern outskirt of the village on 25 acres. The residents have access comprehensive on-site treatment staff, classrooms, gym, fitness center and many outdoor experiential learning opportunities such as gardens, a greenhouse, hammock village, nature trails, orchard, playground and a firepit. Students are encouraged to participate in art programs like underwater photography and poetry/writing.

NWP continuously works to develop relevant and impactful services and elevate the level of care for their residents. They are currently working to strengthen their leadership roles with a new in-house CFO.

The Passage residents are avid library users and we have always had a positive experience with the students!
