MSA has also sent out for proposals on soil sampling with testing agencies to ensure we are getting the best price. Soil sampling with be necessary on both road projects with the DOT.

## **May 2023 Public Works Report**

We have quickly switched gears from winter to summer. The crew and myself are trying to play catch up, and we are slowly getting there:

### Streets

Most streets have been swept at least once. Bid advertisement for road work has been posted and line painting has been scheduled. Due to the harsh winter, we have many more potholes than we would during an average year. We have gone through 12 tons of patching material, and we have a long way to go. We have also been working on replacing and repairing sod along the shoulders, but again, we have a ways to go.

### Sewer

Due to heavy runoff this spring, our WWTP received an excess volume of ground water. Our ponds did hang on, but barely. The spray irrigation system has been de-winterized and spring testing has been completed. We should have the system up and running this week. Installation of a new manhole and main repair on Maple St has been scheduled. A manhole at the intersection of Polk Ave and Ash St has begun to collapse and will need to be replaced. There is a 4-6-week lead time on a new structure, so we ask people to use caution around the area in the meantime.

#### Water

We had a lengthy meeting with members of WI DNR, the Environmental Protection Agency, and local engineers on how to move forward with the Lead Service Line Replacement Accelerator Program. We discussed responsibilities, probable difficulties, and possible solutions. They will be reaching out to us with ideas moving forward regarding public education, as well as identifying and documenting possible lead service connections in the Village.

## **Coon Lake/Parks**

Bathrooms are open and docks are in. I reached out to the local fisheries biologist regarding the winter fish kill in Coon Lake. The DNR will conduct a lake survey later this Spring. If it is determined there was a significant or complete die off, we will be eligible for a restocking effort.

## **Miscellaneous**

Flail Mower has been ordered. Zero turn Mower has been delivered. Talks continue regarding a Village of Frederic/West Sweden Township Co-Op.

Met with Amish to come up with an agreement for using the park and leaving the park as it was found. Still in process of drafting a contract with the Amish for summer use of the ball park.

Approved plans from the Frederic Girl Scouts to install a raised community garden in the north depot park. The Girl Scouts will be completely responsible for maintenance and care of the garden.

Coordinating with Ethan Bergstrom Frederic High School Liaison on projects for Community Give Back Day May 24th (rain date May 25th)

Met with Tech Ed at rink in regards to repairing broken boards/gate. They will be ordering materials from Bass Lake Lumber which will be needed for project.


Met with Bill Struck Public Works and went over Work List for May.



## May 2023 Summary

The Frederic Police Department handled 109 calls for service in April.

We have received no applications to fill the full-time officer position. Peggy Buchman works one Saturday a month to help. Peggy just completed her 24-hour update training in Hayward.

On May 4<sup>th</sup>, we Hosted with TraCS (Traffic and Criminal Software), our state program used for reporting accidents, citations, pursuits and any 'use of force'.

All of our CJIS (Criminal Justice Information Services) yearly audit requirements have been met.

May 5<sup>th</sup> was the MMIWP (Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and People) Task Forces' 2<sup>nd</sup> annual "Wrap the Capitol Red" event to bring awareness to the problem. Unfortunately due to time restraints, I was unable to attend.

On April 27<sup>th</sup>, we were part of a joint effort with the Polk County Sheriff's Department and the St Croix Valley Drug Task Force, to be proactive with an issue developing in town.
