Did you know? There is a walking trail around Coon Lake! You can make it around the whole lake even if the water level is higher. The trailhead is on the East side of the lake. The trail goes through the woods and comes out on the north side of the lake at Hope Road. Once you are out of the woods you can follow the street or walk closer to the lake. When you come to Lake Avenue you will have to walk on the street until you get to West Coon Lake Park. You can continue to follow the lake around behind the bathrooms, and basketball courts. Then take the boardwalk across the south end of the lake and that will bring you back to East Coon Lake Park! The whole route is about 2 miles. It is a beautiful trail! Feel free to contact the Village Office if you have any questions.

We now have a dog park on the south end of the Village at the intersection of Industrial Way and Hwy 35. The Village dog park was funded by grant money! There are rules posted on the fence. Please follow the rules and pick up after your pup so the dog park will be ready for everyone to use.

ORDINANCE INFORMATION: It is against village ordinance to mow or push leaves or grass clippings into the streets. It is as simple as aiming your mower the other way. One bushel of fresh grass clippings can contain 0.1 lbs. of phosphorus—enough to produce 30-50 pounds of algae growth if it finds its way to a lake or river. Please do your part to keep our water clean and your grass clippings out of the street.



The Grass Ordinance states that grass can not be longer than 8 inches and fines may be given. Long grass letters will be sent to residents in violation.

The Public Nuisance Ordinance states residents can not have discarded furniture, rubbish, inoperable vehicles, etc. in yards. Please make sure that your yard is clean, mowed and free of any debris. It is up to all of us to keep Frederic beautiful.



Did you know that if you have a large pile of brush or sticks you can contact Public Works and they may be able to help? They can leave a truck at your property and after you fill it with sticks/brush they will come and pick it up and dispose of it, free of charge!
